# THE FILMS OF ALFRED HITCHCOCK

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Alfred Hitchcock is unquestionably one of the most important directors in cinema history. Indeed, it is difficult to think of a director whose work is more immediately recognizable than Hitchcock's: his subject matter, themes, cinematic and sound techniques are remarkably unique in film history. Many directors – Brian De Palma is an example – owe their aesthetic to Hitchcock; the multitude of Hitchcock impersonators is further testimony to the groundbreaking importance of his cinematic production.

This course will treat Hitchcock's cinema from a number of perspectives. First, we will study some of the signature *technical* motifs in his work (all of which we'll define as the term moves forward): the forward track, the zoom-track shot, his use of sound, the intense visuality of his work. Then we will study some of his recurring *thematic* motifs: his representations of women, his association of guilt with the feminine, his Roman Catholicism, and his continued use of the "wrongly accused" man as a driving plot element. By term's end, you should be able to discuss Hitchcock's work in a language not unlike that used for discussions of literature – in terms of plot, character, diction (Hitchcock possesses a distinctive cinematic diction), style, and so on.

We will watch one film per week. Class will begin with a brief introduction, followed by a screening of the film. There will be a short break after the film, followed by further discussion.
